

Submitting Digital Images for Club Competition

We have made changes!

It is easy to submit your images as digital files for our review:

- 1. Re-size the image to 768 x 1024 pixels using high quality a value range of 10 or 12
- 2. Convert or save the image to jpg
- 3. Save the changes—let's try to use filenames that identify the sender such as LOsborne jpg
- 4. Email the final file to ccclexcontest@gmail.com no later than 11:30 P.M. Tuesday prior to the meeting.

How do you adjust your image?

Here's a couple of approaches:

The club projector has a maximum screen width of 768 x 1024. (Check the website for pictures to go along with this approach) These are Photoshop Elements instructions:

After adjusting your image in Elements and performing whatever corrections are needed, select the cropping tool. Set the width to "10.24 in" and the height to "7.68 in" on the tool bar. Leave the "Resolution" box blank.

After cropping your image save it to JPG format. In Photoshop, use the "Save to web feature".

- Select this feature from the File menu or Shift+Alt+Ctrl+S.
- Check the Constrain Proportions box
- Change the dimensions in the "New Size" box to a width of "1024". If the "Constrain Proportions" box is checked, the "Height" box will automatically change to "768".
- Click the "Apply" button
- Set the jpg quality to "Maximum".
- · Check the "ICC Profile" box. This will save

(Continued from p. 1) your jpg as an sRGB file.

• Press "Enter" and save the image as a 1024 x 768 jpg under whatever name you like. Your image is now ready to take full advantage of our projector's display.

Here's another approach...

- Select File>Automate>Fit Image.
- Specify the pixel dimensions (in our case, width = 1024 and height = 768) and click OK and the image on your screen is re-sized. This approach works well for images, such as a panorama that could lose some of its visual impact if it were cropped to exactly 1024 pixels by 768 pixels.

We're keeping with our photography foundations theme in our May 3 meeting with our "Myers Miraculous Macros Workshop" (actually, it's a Macro Photography workshop with Tom Myers but that didn't sound as snazzy). Tom will be on hand May 3 to share what he knows about shooting the smallest of small things - all of those bugs. Tom will have a variety of macro lenses to show, some excellent images and the proper technique to capture more of them. Bring your camera. There will be opportunities to shoot macro during the workshop.

We will also be making plans to take to the road for hands-on field work - a foray to the arboretum for a chance to shoot some macro images.

We will make other opportunities to go in groups and shoot throughout May and June, like we have in April with the parrot outings. We need to know what interests you and what availability you have, so bring your ideas and calendars.

Our June 5 meeting will be *Show and Tell*-a review/critique meeting. Bring pictures (print, if you are so inclined, or digital images in jpg or png) - parrots, travels, macro-your choice - and we can all discuss how they may have been done differently (perhaps better) or if really they are good just give kudos and the "Ooh and Aah" appreciation scale. What makes a good image? What makes a good image better?

Since this is the halfway mark for the year, we will also be planning the rest of the calendar - ideas required! We are also looking for feedback regarding the offerings thus far.

On July 5, Jeff Lackey will be on hand to help us extend our discussion of "workflow" to include Slideshow Creation. Jeff's workshop will include:

- Presenting a basic show from a folder of images using Windows Photo Viewer (on the fly)
- Building slideshows with Adobe Photoshop Lightroom
- Building slideshows with Photodex Proshow Gold
- Other tools Jeff uses, e.g. Audacity for audio editing
- What to do with your slideshow once you're done - DVD, EXE, PDF, YouTube, mobile, etc.

Although Jeff will use his own images, he welcomes the idea of club members bringing our images (jpg or png, please) on thumb drives to use in a demonstration of slideshow creation.


