February's competition is "Gates & Fences". You are allowed to enter 2 images total; black and white or color, or one of each. Madonna Courtney will critique the entries.

Submitting Digital Images for Club Competition

You may submit 2 images. It is easy to submit your images as digital files for our review:

- 1. Re-size the image to 768 x 1024 pixels using high quality
- a value range of 10 or 12
- 2. Convert or save the image to jpg
- 3. Save the changes—try to use filenames that identify the sender
- 4. Email the final file to ccclexcontest@gmail.com no later than 11:30 P.M. Tuesday prior to the meeting.

How do you adjust your image? Here's a couple of approaches:

- the club projector has a maximum screen width of 768 x 1024. These are Photoshop Elements instructions:
- After adjusting your image in Elements and performing whatever corrections are needed, select the cropping tool. Set the width to "10.24 in" and the height to "7.68 in" on the tool bar. Leave the "Resolution" box blank. After cropping your image save it to JPG format. In Photoshop, use the "Save to web feature".
- Select this feature from the File menu or Shift+Alt+Ctrl+S.
- Check the Constrain Proportions box
- Change the dimensions in the "New Size" box to a width of "1024". If the "Constrain Proportions" box is checked, the "Height" box will automatically change to "768".
- Click the "Apply" button
- Set the jpg quality to "Maximum".
- Check the "ICC Profile" box. This will save your jpg as an sRGB file.
- Press "Enter" and save the image as a 1024 x 768 jpg under whatever name you like. Your image is now ready to take full advantage of our projector's display.

Here's another approach...

- Select File>Automate>Fit Image.
- Specify the pixel dimensions (in our case, width = 1024 and height = 768) and click OK and the image on your screen is re-sized. This approach works well for images, such as a panorama that could lose some of its visual impact if it were cropped to exactly 1024 pixels by 768 pixels.

First Thursday....

The First Thursday meeting for March (the 7th) will be devoted to Photoshop.

Allen Dawson will explain and give examples of the new features in CS6, and then review some of the basics of Photoshop generally, emphasizing the three things to make your Photoshop experience more enjoyable, more efficient, and more likely to make your pictures look better - keyboard shortcuts, understanding and using layer masks, and making your own actions. The best workflow starts with using RAW processing before taking the picture into Photoshop proper, and examples of that will be presented. Feel free to bring your own laptop that has Photoshop on it (any version, not just CS6), but that is certainly not necessary.

Also, if you have one or more problem images that you'd like to see improved, bring

them on a thumb drive, and we can all look at them and offer suggestions.

The meeting will start promptly at 7 PM, so that Jeff Lackey can take a few minutes to show the new CCC website before we get started with Photoshop.

The Dayton Art Institute

Watershed: 100 Years of Photography along the Great Miami River. February 23 2013 - May 5 2013

This exhibition is based on a new publication by the Miami Conservancy District that contrasts historical images documenting the flood and its aftermath with



contemporary photographs depicting similar views. This exhibition presents the medium of photography and the practice of photographers as it has developed during the past 100 years.

Historical materials, including postcards, period equipment and glass slides, document eight cities along the Great Miami River – Piqua, Troy, Dayton, West Carrollton, Miamisburg, Franklin, Middletown and Hamilton.

New images mirroring the old are being captured for this exhibition by Dayton photographer Andy Snow. With broad interests and acute sensitivity, Snow relishes the documentarian approach and allows images to reveal themselves. He is deeply interested in the ways in which the image conveys the energy of the moment. Studies at Princeton with Sol Libsohn and Peter Bunnell taught him to use light and soul to capture an aesthetic narrative.
