Don Mills, 1937-2017 A Tribute by John Snell

On May 24, 2017, the Creative Camera Club lost one of its beloved and revered members, as Don Mills passed away. He and his wife, Maryann, have been faithful



members of the club for approximately 15 years. To most of us, Don was a purist, a photographer who loved film photography, someone who resisted the urge to relegate it to a thing of the past, as the rest of us have done. But he was also more than a purist photographer. He was a philosopher, friend and unsofish sonvart of the

friend and unselfish servant of the camera club.

I don't know exactly when Don and Maryann first joined the club, but I got to know them soon afterward. I began

corresponding with Don via e-mail in early 2003, and this launched a dialog which would, in the ensuing years, consist of more than 1,100 of his electronic messages landing in my inbox. His unique writing style that blended humor and eloquence with a good bit of wisdom delighted me for years. A look back at some of those notes tells much about Don's devotion, not only to his family, but to the club.

In 2004, Don agreed to take on the position of club Vice President, with Maryann serving alongside him as the club secretary. One of his responsibilities was to manage the club's monthly photo competitions. Right off the bat, Don was determined to not let the Scantron machine, that almost antigue and assuredly temperamental device used to

tabulate the club's competition ballots, get the best of him. Perhaps it was his penchant for tinkering with old cameras that convinced him he could take on the Scantron and bend it to his will. About it, he wrote:

You may think that I'm a nut for spending all of this time on the Scantron details, but I have a reason.

It seems to me that the entry/presentation/scoring process can be stressful enough and time consuming enough without the person doing it needing to worry about the operational state of the equipment. I'm just trying to get rid of that potential worry for both me and the next person doing this.

I will admit however, that I have a personality characteristic that causes dangling loose ends to bother the daylights out of me. Unfortunately, this is a selective characteristic. I can be lazy and sloppy as the dickens with my

photography and it doesn't bother me one little bit, yet still want that club slide competition to run perfectly.

Using parts from two Scantrons, Don made one good working machine, and the scoring system ran smoothly afterwards for a number of years.

After a couple of years as Vice President of the club, Don assumed the duties of treasurer, a position he held through 2015. During that time, Don took on the challenge of applying for, and obtaining, an IRS designation for the club as a 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation.



Through it all, he maintained a steadfast love of photography, primarily with black and white film. He took great delight shooting with old cameras he'd tinkered with and rebuilt himself, and often in his letters made mention of old Crown Graflex's or Rollei TLRs or rangefinders...technology with which I was not familiar, but which I nevertheless enjoyed reading about from Don's perspective. He had this to say about digital cameras:

I find myself wondering, every once in a while, why I have so little interest in moving to digital for everyday photography. I use digital for pictures to go in eBay ads, but that's about it. I did do one digital shot that ended up in a print show, but that was only because Maryann had her camera and her 15mm lens with her one day when I encountered a scene that needed a very wide angle to capture it. I'll admit to a bit of envy for the ease and speed of previewing a shot in the field, but it's not enough to offset the pleasure I derive from using one of my old classic cameras for the same shot. Different strokes for different folks I guess.

Don and Maryann were also faithful attendees of the annual club photo trips I



organized. To my knowledge, the only one they missed between 2003 and 2015 was in 2014, when the trip dates coincided with that of a NASCAR race at Kentucky Speedway, an event they already had tickets for and which was a sporting event for which they shared a mutual love. They were otherwise at the photo trips to Red River Gorge, North Carolina, the Smokies and other venues where the CCC folks gathered. Don won a Best of Show award with a photo he took one of those trips!

I just finished my selection for this year and it came out as it does every year. To me, recognition is nice if it comes your way, but if the truth be known I care very little, at an emotional level, what the judges or even the club members think of what I enter. They are not entered to win things, they are entered because they are me.

There's much more that could be written about Don. Many of you no doubt have favorite stories to tell, as well, and I'm sure you remember him fondly, as I certainly do. Our sincere thanks go out to Maryann and and to the rest of Don's family for sharing him with us all of these years, and we hope they will accept our heartfelt condolences in this time of their, and our, loss. He will be dearly missed!
