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Photojournalist and Nature Photographer Pam Spaulding to Present March Program

The Creative Camera Club is honored to have Pam Spaulding as our featured speaker on March 16th. She will present a program on photographing birds.

Spaulding was a photojournalist for the *Louisville Courier-Journal* for 40 years. She contributed to the photography that won the *Courier-Journal* and *Louisville Times* the 1976 Pulitzer Prize for coverage of courtordered busing in Jefferson County, Kentucky. In 1984-85 she was a Nieman Fellow at Harvard University, only the seventh photographer to be selected since 1938.







Her primary work has been photographing the everyday lives of people in Kentucky but she also has taken every opportunity to pursue stories about Kentucky's flora and fauna. Since her retirement, she spends most of her time photographing birds.

She has had three books published of her work and has been published in numerous books and magazines such as *Horticulture*, the *National Geographic* and *Traveler magazines*.

Red River Gorge, My Second Home DATE: March 14th, 6:00 p.m. LOCATION: McConnell Springs ARTIST: John Snell

As part of the McConnell Springs 2017 Author Speaker Series, John Snell will present a talk on March 14th about his coffee-table book, "Red River Gorge, My Second Home." The talk will feature photographs of that 35,000-acre wilderness, as well as some of the history surrounding a successful fight against the US Army Corps of Engineers' plans to build a dam in "the gorge" several decades ago. The foreword to the book, written by retired Lexington attorney Oscar Geralds, Jr., one of the leaders of the fight against the dam, focuses on that time in history. McConnell Springs is located at 416 Rebmann Lane, off Old Frankfort Pike, between New Circle Road and Forbes Road

Irving Penn (b. 1917, Plainfield, NJ; d. 2009, New York, NY) was one of the twentieth century's most prolific and influential photographers of fashion and the famous. His pictures, a unique blend of classical elegance and formal innovation, were widely seen in print during his long career at Vogue magazine. His achievement, however, extends beyond conventional notions of depicting beauty or fame to include a radical reconsideration of how we understand fashion, photography, and art, separately and in relation to each other.

Beyond Beauty, the first retrospective museum survey to be organized since the artist's death, describes the full arc of Penn's photography, from his early, surrealistinfluenced work and innovative fashion imagery for which he is best known to the elegiac still lifes and iconoclastic late work that simultaneously incorporate and renounce conventional notions of beauty.
