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Street Photography Composition-Curves

In anticipation of the October competition "CURVES," you may be interested in a few tips to bring out the best in your images. The following is an edited excerpt from a post by Eric Kim. Curves are the most dynamic forms of lines out there. They add energy, suspense, elegance, movement, power, motion, and direction to a photograph. Curves are a little more difficult to spot when out shooting than horizontal, vertical, or diagonal lines. However if you look closely enough and are attentive enough– you can capture them to create stunning images.

With composition, everything starts at nature. What curves can you think of that occur in **nature**? Some things that come to mind: rivers, a woman's body, solar systems, sand at the beach, seashells, hills, leaves and much, much, more.





Let us think of

some other curves that are **man-made**. Some things that come to mind: highways (and speedways), stairwells, graphs, arches, snakes and much, much, more.

So how can we better apply curves to make our images more dynamic, elegant, and flow-well?

Let us look at some examples from the masters ory– this famous image by Henri Cartier-Bresson:

Exhibition Guidelines:

- We recommend that you not submit photos you plan to place in the CCC Print Show, unless you have a duplicate copy. All prints in the St. Joe exhibit must remain on display throughout the dates of the exhibit.
- There is room for 10 prints to be exhibited.
- The prints cannot be wider than 24" (including frame), but they may be taller than 24". This is due to the limited linear wall space we're provided.
- Prints may be framed in metal or wood, or may be on canvas or metal.
- Limit one print per person.

- Bring your work to the First Thursday meeting on November 2nd. John Snell will collect your work at this time. This is the ONLY time John will be collecting prints.

He might have seen an empty scene like this:



I am not 100% certain that HCB saw the background, framed it, and waited for the right person to enter. Who knows– it could have all happened spontaneously. But considering that HCB was a patient photographer– and was also into hunting– I am sure he waited all day for the scene and for the right person to enter.

Either that, or he paid the guy on the bicycle \$5 to loop around a few times (just kidding).

But if we analyze this empty scene- you can see all the curves that were apparent in the scene- from the curve on the top, to the railing leading from the bottom left to the center, and the stairway. All of them add energy and motion to the shot. And of course the missing ingredient is having the slightly blurred biaselo (which a



blurred bicycle (which suggest motion) in the shot.

Based on what my eyes see- all of these curving lines seem to point towards the direction of the bicyclist- which is left. This makes the bicyclist look as if he is moving 100 miles per hour.

Takeaway point? If you see a great scenes with a lot of curves just waiting for youwait for the right person to complete the composition and click.

Carter Caves Outing on Nov 4th

Our Carter Caves outing is November 4th! We will convene at Carter Caves state park Saturday, Nov 4th in the morning, with a general meet-up around 9:30 a.m. at the visitors center.

We will shoot the various arches, the box canyon, and other features of the park in the morning. For lunch everyone is free to picnic or eat at the lodge. Final time to access the cave (Cathedral Cavern) will be announced at the October regular meeting, but it will probably be around 2:00 p.m.

Bring your tripod and flashes. (Flash is not allowed if bats are present). The Rangers will allow us into the cave at the back of a tour group then allow us free roam of any lit area until the next group comes in. They basically lock us in the cave!

Bringing a flashlight is suggested. Light painting some of the formations can yield some nice images. We hope to see you there!
