Participants have the opportunity to network with and learn from some of the best photographers in the world in a bucolic Kentucky setting. Additionally, this is a great opportunity to socialize with other club members.

Here's the schedule of activities:

PhotoScenic Gallery print exhibit will be held again this year. Bring three photographic prints (not larger than 16x20 – including the mount) to share and display in the gallery.

FRIDAY NIGHT:

- PhotoScenic Weekend will start at 3pm Friday afternoon with a couple classes on techniques and a Q. and A. session for those who can make it early.
- First photo contest of the weekend Participants can enter up to three digital images that have been photographed in the last year. Subjects include scenics and closeups. Digital requirements will follow closer to October.
- Friday night's speaker is Emmy Award winning photojournalist Michael E Keating. As a photojournalist, he worked for the Cincinnati Enquirer for 25 years. His photographs of the Queen City are beautiful, troubling and revealing. Keating will speak about his years of photographing in the Cincinnati region.

SATURDAY:

- Participants will shoot during the day in preparation for the Saturday night competition. The subject theme for the Saturday night contest will be announced Friday evening.
- Saturday night's speaker, Steve Raymer is a photojournalist, author, educator and Professor Emeritus of the Indiana University Media School. He was also a long-time National Geographic Magazine staff photographer. After serving in Vietnam as an officer in the U. S. Army, he joined the staff of National Geographic in 1972, launching a career that has taken him to more than 100 countries. Raymer's photographs illustrated more than 30 bylined National Geographic Magazine articles.
