*2019 dues must be paid in order to be eligible for Creative Camera Club Competitions.

Shadows (April)

Shadow images where the subject of the photography is the shadow of the subject. These images may be created via either natural or artificial light. The item casting the shadow may or may not even be in the image.

Backlighting (June)

Am image where the primary light source (either natural or artificial) MUST be located primarily BEHIND the subject of the image, thus rendering the subject in a state from partial to complete silhouette


Light Painting (August)

Light painting describes photographic techniques of moving a light source while taking the photograph, either to illuminate a subject or space, or to shine light at the camera to 'draw', or by moving the camera itself during exposure of light sources. To be considered light painting the photographer or an assistant MUST be in control of the light.

Candid People (October)

Candid people Images are those which are captured in such a way that the subjects of the image are not under the control of the photographer. Subjects MAY be aware of the camera but not reacting to it.

Tribute to Dorsey Davis



By now, most of you know that our friend and fellow photographer, <u>Dorsey Davis</u> of Lancaster, Ky, passed away a few weeks ago after a long bout with brain cancer. Dorsey posted a notice about his diagnosis in November, 2017. He did not know then just how long he had to live, but he made it clear that his Christian faith that had sustained him all of his life would continue to be his anchor for the days he had remaining on this earth.

Dorsey frequently posted his beautiful nature photographs on Facebook, often linking them to "Gallery45 Studios," the name of a business he shared with his talented photographer son, Tyler Davis. Not only did he freely share his artistry, but he wrote brief essays about most of the photos, thereby enabling the viewer to more fully experience the essence of those images and the experience of being there when they were taken.

Dorsey was a long-time member of the camera club and a frequent winner of competition awards, including Best of Show in one of the Annual Print Shows. The critiques he did of club competitions were as good as any we experienced. He loved to travel, often taking photo trips to Michigan's Upper Peninsula, southern Indiana (where he grew up), the Blue Ridge Parkway and the Smokies. The images he shared from those places were beautifully crafted and always a delight to see.

The photo of Dorsey that accompanies this post was taken by John Snell during a camera club trip to the Smokies in July, 2006. Though many of us by then had converted to digital technology, Dorsey, ever the photo perfectionist, continued to crank out top quality images with that Pentax 6x7 film camera. He later converted to digital, but only when he was certain that doing so would not compromise the quality his film images had always displayed.

He was a frequent attendee of camera club trips to the Blue Ridge Parkway each summer, and he eagerly and unselfishly shared with lots of us the locations of many beautiful photo spots he'd discovered. To his family and friends, the camera club offers its sincere condolences. We will truly miss him!
