Projects, Presentations, and Perceptions





We are pleased to welcome John S Hockensmith as he discusses his pathway to photographic portfolio creation. He will present a couple of short slide shows of the most recent portfolios. "The Chrysalis Project" and "Back to Creation" will be discussed and how these two portfolios came to fruition. He will share his understanding of how he finds inspiration, the image collection process, and how the decisions that make up a presentation lead to the viewer's perceptions. This 30min presentation will be followed by a Q & A discussion on camera club members' photographic project ideas.

John Stephen Hockensmith studied art and photography at Georgetown College and began his career as a photographer for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In 1978, Mr. Hockensmith left his government job to begin his business as an independent photographer and picture framer in Georgetown, Kentucky. Throughout the 1980s, he consistently pursued fine arts in

addition to managing Hockensmith —Cont'd from page 1 his business. In 1994.

Mr. Hockensmith defined his love of art with an equine theme to acclaim. From the mid-1990s to the present, he has published, exhibited, and distributed fine equine art throughout the United States and internationally. Mr. Hockensmith still owns and operates his studio, Fine Art Editions Gallery and Press, and his art has evolved to include book publishing, artist representation, and giclée printmaking. His books are *Gypsy Horses and the Traveler's Way* (2006), *Spanish Mustangs in the Great American West* (2009) and most recently, a pictorial biography of the life of artist Henry Faulkner titled *The Gift of Color: Henry Lawrence Faulkner* (2018).

All entries must be received by 11:59 pm on Sunday 10.16.2022. No exceptions will be allowed for entries received after the deadline or entries which were emailed to an incorrect address.

Submitted images should be formatted to fit within the maximum pixel dimensions of the club projector (no more than 1920 pixels wide and 1080 pixels high). File names should include the member name, competition class, and type.

50th CCC Annual Print Show

Despite the fact that our Annual Print Show has been held at The Living Arts & Science Center for most of the past ten or so years, they filled up their gallery schedule without contacting us to see if we wanted to have another show at their site. Because of that, this year's Annual Print Show will be held at LexArts, 161 N. Mill Street, Lexington, KY 40507 during the months of January and February, 2023. To quote the LexArts website, "LexArts is greater Lexington's premier cultural development, advocacy and fund raising organization." Among their many activities, LexArts conducts the popular Gallery Hops held throughout Lexington six times each year. For more information about them, go to https://lexarts.org/ about/.

Please mark these dates on your calendars: January 7, 2023 - Turn in prints at LexArts between 10am-noon. Members will help install the show that afternoon

January 12, 2023 - Judging of the show, followed by the monthly CCC meeting and commentary from the judges

January 20, 2023 - Gallery Hop February 25, 2023 or March 4, 2023 (to be determined) - Pick up prints from the show

In order to participate in the Print Show, you MUST have attended at least six club functions during the calendar year AS A DUES-PAYING MEMBER. Qualifying functions include the 1st and 3rd Thursday meetings, Board meetings, SIG meetings and other club-authorized field trips such as club outings to the Blue Ridge Parkway or West Virginia.

When pricing your prints, factor in the 30% commission that LexArts will deduct from any print sales.

Rules for the Annual Print Show are on the CCC website under the tab of "Competitions." Please

note that the Wild Card topic for this year's show is "Kentucky Historic Buildings."

Pay close attention to the rules relating to framing, as the frames MUST BE SIMPLE METAL FRAMES (of any color), and the images must be under glass. It's preferred that the prints be matted, but that's not required. There must be a wire on the back of the frame so it is ready to hang on a nail. Because a hanging system of suspended wires will not be used for this show, it is not necessary that the wire be drawn tightly across the back of the frame as in recent years. But the wire must be present.

In determining how large your print may be, as long as the glass size does not exceed 384 square inches (equivalent to 16"x24"), and the longest dimension of the glass is not more than 36 inches, the print is eligible to be entered.

The only category in which composite photos are allowed is the "Creative" category. In that category, practically "anything goes!" For all other categories, however, multiple frame shots employing techniques such as HDR, stitching of images from a scene and focus stacking (such as Helicon Focus) are allowed.

I know many of these items are spelled out in the competition rules on the website. However, every year someone will try to enter a print in a nonmetal frame, a print without glass or a print that's too large. In these cases, the print will be rejected and prohibited from being in the show. So, PLEASE pay attention to the rules!
